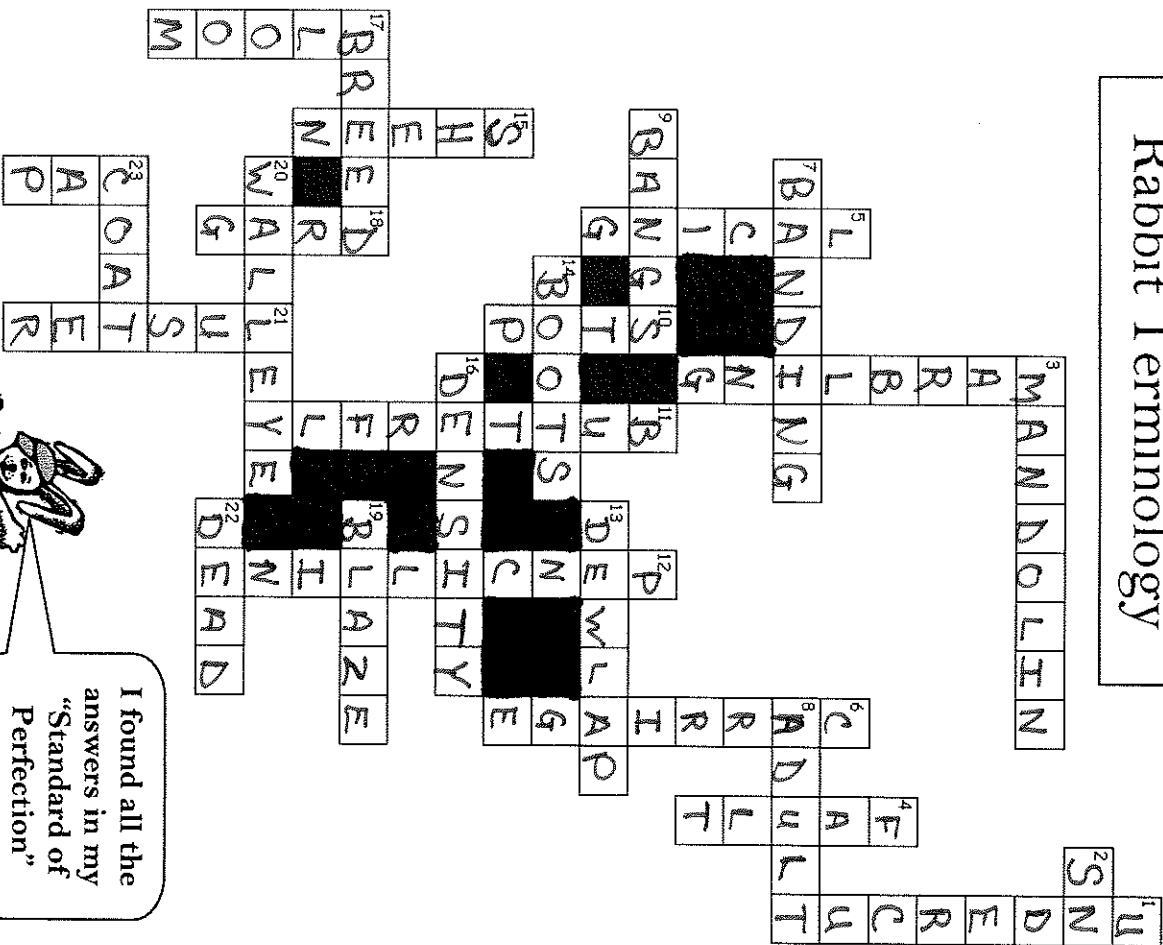

## Across

- An elongated, narrow head usually with a pinched muzzle
- Body shape typical of the semi-arched breeds
- A hair shaft having various colors (think agouti)
- A mature rabbit of breeding age
- The longer wool appearing at the front base of the ears & top of head on some wool breeds
- A pendulous fold of loose skin that hangs from the throat
- The colored markings on the feet and legs of pointed pattern rabbits
- The property or quality of a thick coat of fur
- A class of domestic rabbits that reproduces itself with distinctive characteristics
- The white marking found on the face of a Dutch
- An eye that is whitish on the surface (two words)
- Word used for a hard, brittle tail due to loss of circulation
- The fur covering of a rabbit

## Down

- When skeletal / muscular structure doesn't fill the lower hindquarter
- A mottling of the eye color
- A deviation from perfection
- A word for the colored line of fur that outlines the sides and tips of the ears
- The style in which a rabbit carries its ears
- The marking on each rear hock of a Dutch
- A nose marking found on some marked breeds or broken varieties
- A protrusion of fur, not including skin across the throat and under the chin (two words)
- Term used to describe the principal feature of the satin mutation
- The vitality and finish of a coat in good condition
- The intrusion of a color marking into a white marking area
- Term used to describe the brightness/brilliance of a Havana
- The marking line where lower ear color stops and joins head color (Checked Giant)
